FRESHMEN

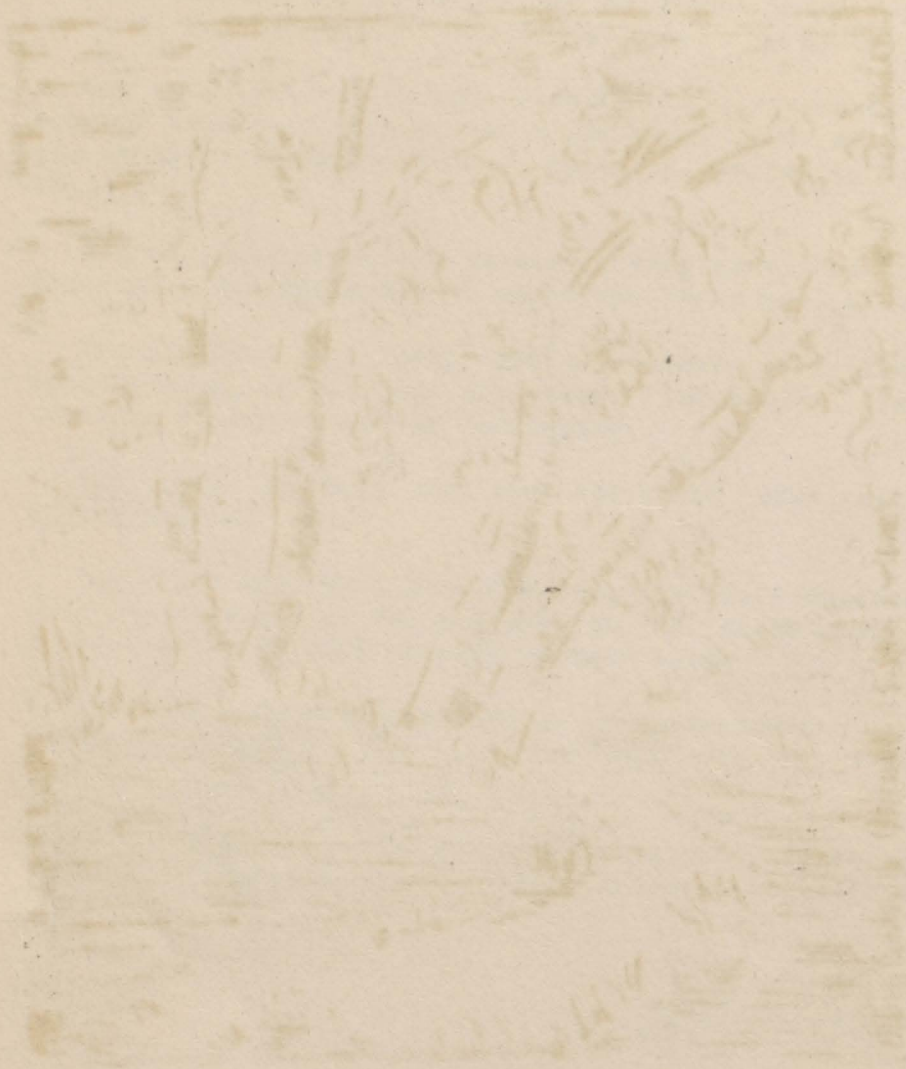

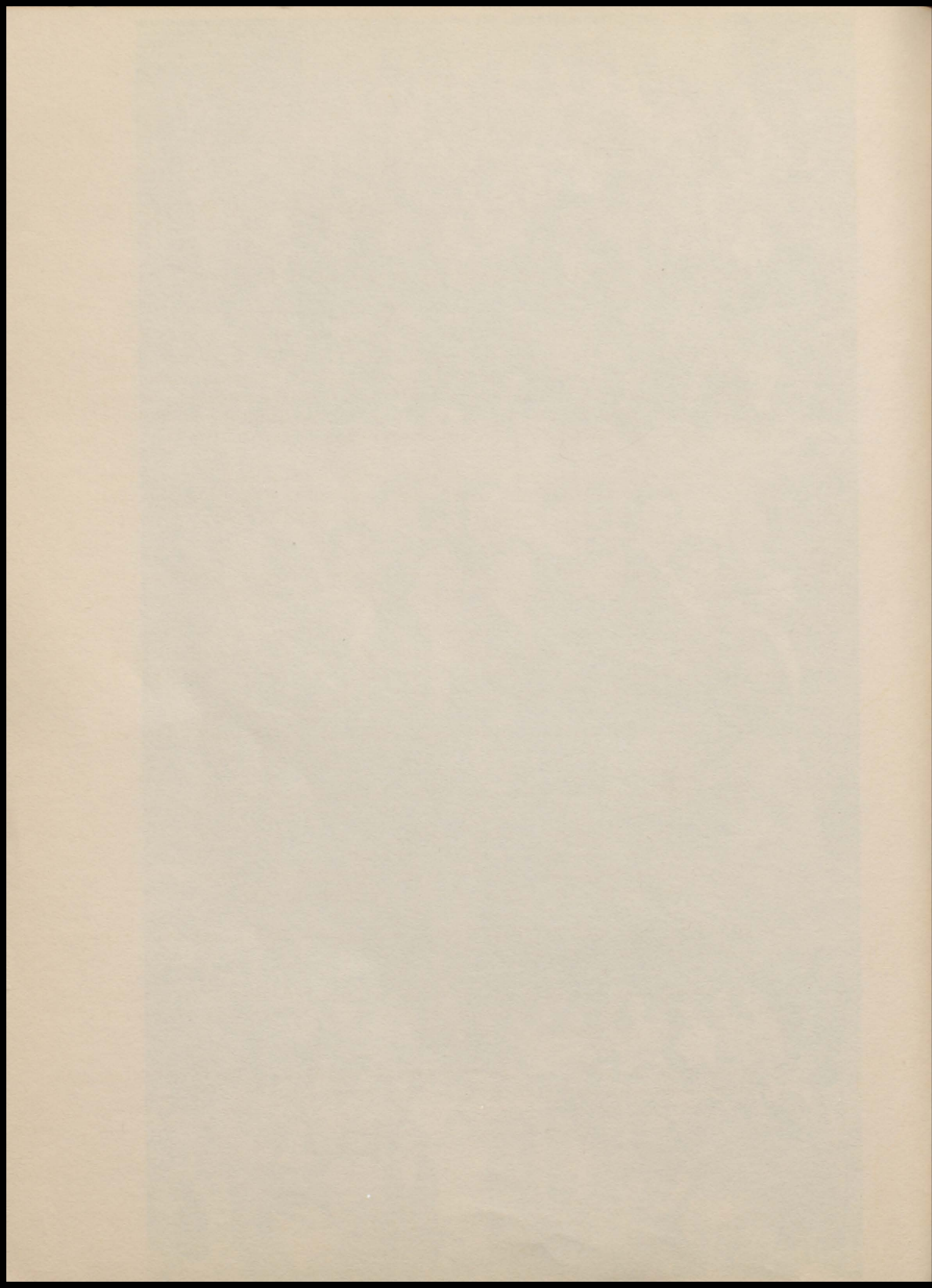
BASEBALL
