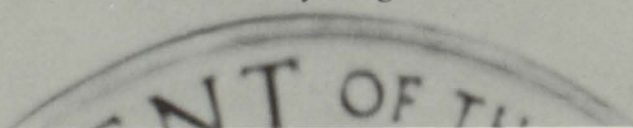




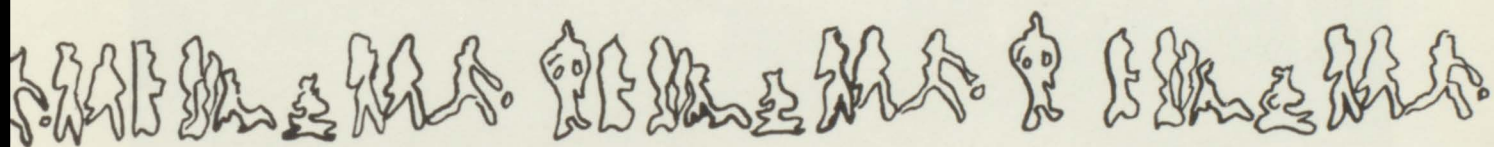
We, the 1964 annual staff, pay tribute, in this our 50th anniversary edition, to the memory of the late John Fitzgerald Kennedy.
