 We too may be fossils ..... in later life.



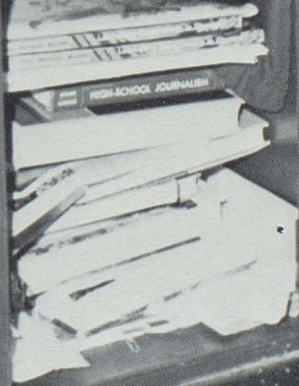

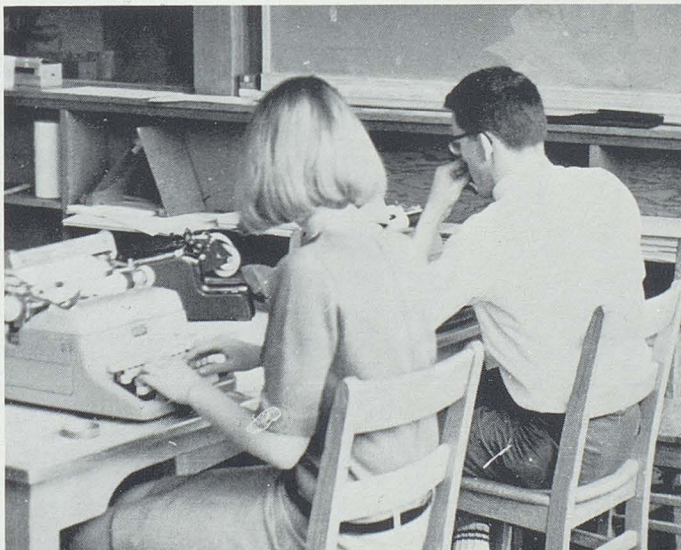

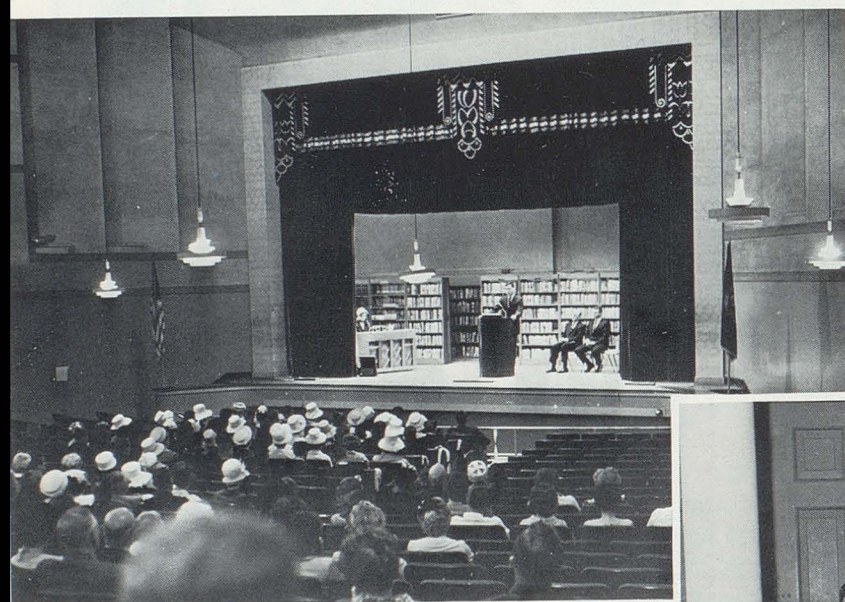
