# A BLAST FROM OUR PAST LEADING IDOLS 

Both Jimi Hendrix \& Kurt Cobain originally came from Washington and suffered a tragic death that shocked our nation and music industry. People looked up to them as leading icons in the music business. Acknowledging our past, they both amazed fans and charted to the top lists. Although tragedy had to hit both of these young stars who had changed the shape and face of music, their music still inspires today.
Kurt Cobain, a loving father, husband and adored by millions. As the lead singer as well as guitarist of his metal group NIRVANA, Kurt was originally born in Hoquim, WA, on Feb. 20th, 1967. In the year of 1986 Nirvana the group was formed leading them as a future success.
Although we could never understand Kurt Cobain, he lived a suicidal life. In one event, he was rushed to the hospital after consuming 50 prescription painkiller pills with champagne. Then on April 5th, he barricaded himself, then put a shotgun in his mouth and pulled the trigger. His body was then discovered by an electrician who had come to check out the house with a suicide note. Two days after his death, 5000 people gathered in Seattle for a special candlelight Vigil in his honor. Dwelling over the evidence of Kurt's death, many have certain theory's upon this incident, like did Kurt really commit suicide or was he murdered?

Jimi Hendrix, a guitar rock legend who died of drug overdose during his 4 -year reign as a superstar. Jimi was born in Seattle and is known to have changed the face and form of music. He was a talented songwriter, dynamic performer, and studio pioneer. During his reign he performed with R \& B masters and remained a chart topper. Devastating news hit the world when it was concluded that Jimi Hendrix had died in London on September 18th, 1970, when he was on his European Tour.

Tennis, the name given to the game differs in different countries. In Great Britain, it is called Tennis or, to distinguish it from Lawn Tennis, Real Tennis or Royal Tennis.

In the USA it is called Court Tennis: in France Jeu de Paume (hand ball): and in Australia Royal Tennis. The various names throw light on the development of the game.

Tennis originated in France before the 12th century. The whole appearance of a tennis court is influenced by its origins. The first courts were to be found in courtyards immediately adiacent to a castle or in cloistered monastery quadrangles. Originally, the players played with their hands (jeu de paume). Later they used gloves, then short bats to hit the ball. The game became very popular and in the 13th century it is said that there were as many as 1,800 courts in France. Lawn Tennis, which derived from Real Tennis in about 1874, is played on a marked-out surface without side or end walls.

Court Tennis, to use the American name for tennis, indicates that tennis is played in a specially court with walls on four sides. No two tennis courts are exactly alike. That at Hampton Court is marginally wider than others. Other differences occur in the width or angle of the penthouse roof above the corridor and in the width of the tambour. Today the number of courts has dwindled. There are 17 courts in use in Great Britain; 7 in the USA; 2 in France; and 3 in Australia.

There are not more than a few thousand players in the world; but they make up in keenness for any lack of numbers. There are amateur, professional open and world competitions. The main tennis participants are young girls and boys such as those at MHS.
